During Richard's tenure in Frederick he has overseen public and private revitalization efforts including the design and development of the award-winning urban Carroll Creek Park and developments delivering jobs and improving the tax base in downtown and commercial corridors. Additionally, he has worked with many businesses to locate and expand in Frederick including AstraZeneca, Flying Dog Brewery, Fort Detrick, National Laboratory for Cancer Research, Wells Fargo, Wegmans and many others.
